- the four key emergency presentations (the unconscious patient, the shocked patient, cardio-respiratory arrest and anaphylaxis)
- the most common symptom-based presentations, such as breathlessness and chest pain

Using the clinical scenarios, you can follow a patient from the initial presentation, where you can review a patient's medical history and perform a virtual examination. You can then move on to developing an investigation or a management plan and finally to the
